Top price €7,000 / Avg. Price €4,032

Many would have thought this sale in Tullamore was going to be a buyer's market, with a massive 123 Charolais bulls catalogued. Fortunately for the seller's, this did not prove to be the case. Straight from the outset it was clear that quality bulls were highly sought after, and buyers were plentiful for them. A top price of €7,000 was achieved twice, with an average sale price of €4,032 and a clearance of 75%. Trade was boosted by the fact that many bulls had been sold on farm prior to the Sale.



Selling for the joint top price of €7,000 was Crossane4 Supreme, exhibited by the McGovern brothers from Co. Sligo. This Doonally New son secured the Senior Championship under Judge Michael Hargroves earlier in the day. Turning two years old in March 2023, Supreme cataloqued with a five-star terminal index of €153 and carries one copy of both myostatin genes. He sold to a suckler farm in Co. Offaly.



Also selling at €7,000 was the first prize-winner, Baurnafea Stephen, exhibited by John Bambrick from Co. Kilkenny. This May 2021 born bull is a son of the herd's stock bull Baurnafea Nelson and a Loulou bred dam. He carried a five star terminal index of €159 and a calving figure of just 5.2% on beef cows. He was wrapped up by a suckler farmer from Co. Limerick.

The Bambrick's success did not stop there. They also received a call of €5,000 for Baurnafea Scott, another son of Baurnafea Nelson and a Loulou bred dam. This stylish young heifer is a daughter of the promising Al bull, Mornity Nero, and a homebred dam by First. His dam Western Icon is a Pirate daughter whose ET calves a proving highly successful for the Purcell's. Having been placed third in the pre-sale show, Stratos went to sale with a five star terminal index of €155 and one copy of the Q204X gene, making him an appealing option to suckler farmers. After a marathon of bidding, Aidan Hearty from Northern Ireland had the last call.



Next best at €10,800 was Sagesse Sidney (et), bred by the Canning family in Sligo and exhibited by David Watts from Co. Galway. Once again Doonally New was the sire, with Kilcumreragh Grimaldi as the dam. This October 2021 born bull stood Reserve Overall Junior Champion in the pre-sale show under the watchful eye of Judge Will Owen from Wales. Sidney catalogued with one copy of both myostatin genes and carries a five star terminal index of €153. He sold online to Mark Wattie's Tonley herd in Scotland.



Two bulls exchanged hands at €10,200. The first to do so was Tawny Super Dude exhibited by Ciaran Daly from Co. Leitrim. Sired by the AI sire First and out of a Doonally New bred cow.

He was born in July and went to sale with two copies of the Q2O4X gene, a calving figure of just 3.7% on beef cows, and a massive terminal index of €171. Having received bids from all corners off the ring, Tom Cox eventually dropped the hammer on this one to Seamus Walshe from Co. Roscommon.



Second to hit the €10,200 mark was Williamstown Sam exhibited by Aidan Farrell from Co. Westmeath. along with a calving figure of 6.5% on beef cows. Tom Cox dropped the hammer on this one at €6,500, destined for a suckler herd in Northern Ireland.







Topping the trade was the Reserve Male Champion Rooskeynamona Theodore, who sold for €6,600. Exhibited by Gerard Mulligan from Co. Leitrim, this powerful young bull is a son of Bullbank's Sportmans Neptune, and a homebred Pirate dam. Born in January 2022, Theodore carries two copies of the F94L profit gene. Although low on indexes, this classy bull attracted bids from several pedigree and commercial farmers. A stark reminder that indexes are just a tool, and not everything when selecting cattle. Something everyone involved in cattle breeding in Ireland should keep in mind, especially with the various schemes being introduced at present.

Next best at €5,500 was Ballytrain Tom, a son of First and a Blelack Digger bred dam.

Bred and exhibited by Brendan McConnell from Co. Monaghan, this 13 month-old bull attracted significant interest in the sales ring. As his breeding would suggest, indexes were in abundance, with stars displayed right down the page. Tom also carries one copy of the Q204X myostatin gene. He sold to a suckler farmer from Co. Clare.




Selling at €5,400 was Dereskit Tanko, the property of Basil Bothwell from Co. Cavan. This 15 month-old bull is a son of the NCBC Al sire Lapon, and a homebred dam by Alwent Goldbar. Tanko offered a terminal index of €156, along with a calving figure of just 4% on beef cows. He also carries one copy of the F94L gene. Snapping this one up was a suckler farmer from Co. Galway.

Francis Ryan from Rosscahill in Co. Galway was one of the first high sellers through the ring with Landleague Spud at €5,300. This was accompanied by a calving figure of 4.9% on beef cows and a carcass weight figure of +42.4 kgs. He also went west to a suckler farmer in Co. Galway.

Gerard Farrell from Newtowncashel in Co. Longford received a call of €4,900 for his rising 15 month-old bull Portanure Trump. This young bull is a son of Dovea's Bud Orpheus and a Baltazhar bred dam. Having the last call on this one was a suckler farmer from Co. Sligo.



Basil Bothwell from Co. Cavan was back in the money once again when he traded his second offering Dereskit Topper 1126 for €4,800. This 15 month-old son of Roughan Nutella carries two copies of the profit gene, and displayed a carcass weight figure of +41.9kgs. He went south to a suckler farmer in Co. Kerry.

Two more bulls would hit the €4,800 mark. The first to do so was Clonaltra Topper for Terry Bradley from Co. Westmeath. A son of Fleetwood and a Pirate bred dam, Topper carries a five-star terminal index of €158 and a calving figure of just 4.8% on beef cows. He also possesses one copy of the Q gene.

The last and final bull to trade at €4,800 was Sliabhbloom Tom, exhibited by Danny Weston from Co. Laois. This high index young bull is a son of Voimo and a homebred dam by Nelson. As well as offering a page full stars, he also carries a calving figure of just 4.8% on beef COWS.



Larahill Titus (et)

Judges John Searson and his daughter Megan selected Larahill Titus (et) as their Male Champion. This 15 month-old son of Pirate was exhibited by John O'Connor from Co. Westmeath. Unfortunately he failed to meet his reserve in the sales ring.



Topping the small offering of females was the Champion heifer Dalehill Serena, exhibited by Basil and Victoria Kells from Co. Cavan. This two year old heifer is a Fiston daughter and sold in-calf. She went to sale with an eye-catching replacement index of €114 and was knocked down at €4,500 to a breeder from Co. Cork.

The Elite Charolais Heifer Sale in Carrick-on-Shannon seen the return of the Society to the Midland and Western Livestock Showgrounds for the first time in nearly 10 years. Regarded as Ireland's Premier Pedigree Cattle Sales venue, the Showgrounds certainly lived up to its reputation.

Just over 75% of the heifers catalogued found new homes, selling to a healthy average of €4,275. It should also be noted that a number of heifers left the ring unsold at over €5,000.


Leading the way at a whopping €18,000 was the Overall Junior Champion, Lisnagre Triona (et), exhibited by Jim Geoghegan from Co. Westmeath. This exceptionally powerful young heifer is no stranger to success, having picked up the Senior Female Calf Championship at the Society's Calf Show in September. She is a daughter of the Society bull Horace JD, and Lisnagre Gina (et), who goes back to

North Leitrim, she went on to sell for €8,000. A daughter of Goldstar Echo and a home bred daughter of Meillard Rj, this October 2021 born heifer sold in calf to Lapon. Having the final call on this one was Damien McCaffery from Northern Ireland.



The day's Reserve Junior Champion went the way of Aghafad Tessa for well-known Louth breeder, Paddy Farrelly. Bred by Edward Walshe from Co. Monaghan, this stylish young heifer is a daughter of the easy calving NCBC sire, Orbi. The sale resulted in a 72% clearance, with bulls selling to an average of €4,060. Trade topped at €9,000 for the day's Overall Senior Champion, Kilcleagh Tom. A total of 12 bulls sold for €5,000 or more, highlighting the demand for the top end bulls.

The sale topper and the Overall Senior Champion was exhibited by Noel Farrell from Co. Westmeath. A son of Fiston and out of a Bova Sylvain bred dam, this May 2022 born bull displayed a tremendous set of figures along with a calving figure of 7.6% on beef cows. At +45kg on Carcass Weight and +2.4 on Carcass Confirmation, Tom proved to be a suckler man's dream. He sold to a suckler farmer from Co. Clare.



Sunnaghmore Timmy (et)

Hot on his heels at €7,300 was the first prize winner from the first class of bulls, Sunnaghmore Timmy (et), exhibited by Andy McGovern from Co. Leitrim. This March 2022 born bull is a son of Pirate out off a Doonally New bred dam. He catalogued with a five-star terminal index of €137 and carries one copy of the Q204X gene. A Co. Roscommon suckler farmer had the last call on this one.



Patrick Hughes from Co. Cavan was in the money when his bull Pottlereagh Tyson went under the hammer at €6,600. This 17 monthold bull is a son of Giono and a homebred dam by Cavelands Fenian. He atalogued with a five-star terminal index of €159 and a calving figure of 5.9%. He also carried one copy of the Q gene. Snapping the Champion up was a Co. Clare suckler farmer.



Michael Kiernan from Co. Leitrim received a call of €5,400 for his first prize winner Gallaway Trueman. A son of Mullawn Noble and a Jaquard bred dam, Noble is a double carrier of the Q gene. 


The 2023 Christmas Cracker Sale can only be described as a fantastic day for the Charolais breed. Just over 80 bulls went through the ring, with 70 of those selling to a staggering average of €5,581. The highest average sale price ever achieved at a Society Sale in Ireland, across all breeds. A blistering trade, taking into account the average age of these bulls was just 15 months old. The average sale price was up nearly €500 on the previous year, a sale that was regarded as a flyer at the time. Just over 20 bulls went for export, with bulls going to Northern Ireland, Scotland, England, and Wales.

Stealing the show and selling for the day's top price of €16,200 was the Reserve Overall Junior Champion, Cloonglasna11 Tarzan. This much-admired young bull was bred and exhibited by the Egan brothers from Ballina in Co. Mayo. At just 13 months old, this outstanding bull is a son of the Society bull, Neptune, and the Mayo men's prolific breeding cow, Cloonglasna11 Jenny. As well as displaying all the looks, Tarzan had the indexes to match, carrying a five-star terminal index of €180 along with a calving figure of just 5% on beef cows. After some exciting bidding, he was eventually knocked down to Wissington Charolais in the UK.



It was the Overall Intermediate Champion, Sagesse Timothy, that was next best in the sales ring at €12,100. Exhibited by the Canning family from Rosses Point in Co. Sligo, Timothy was no stranger to success, having been awarded the Overall Champion at this year's National Charolais Show in Tullamore. He is a son of Balmyle Vagabond and Sagesse Martha, who herself was a National Champion in Tullamore. Born in September 2022, the Sligo bull attracted significant interest in the sales ring before getting snapped up by M&S McManus in Northern Ireland.



Ballydownan The Rock (et)

Peter Spollen from Geashill in Co. Offaly had a good day out when he received a call of €10,300 for the second prize-winner, Bally-downan The Rock (et). A son of the great CF52 and a home bred dam by Texan Gie, this tremendously well-made bull caught the eye of well-known suckler farmer Michael Connellan from Co. Roscommon. He sold with a five-star terminal index of €136, as well as carrying one copy of the Q204X gene.



Dhuish Thunder

The fourth bull to hit the €10,000 mark was Dhuish Thunder, the property of Gerard McIntyre from Co. Cavan. A son of Lapon and a Crossmolina Jupiter bred dam, this 14 month old bull picked up a red rosette in the pre-sale show in a stiff class of bulls. He was wrapped up a suckler farmer from Co. Sligo. The Quin family also received a sum of €6,400 for Clenagh2 Thor (et), a son of the great Domino and a White-cliffe James bred dam. He catalogued with a massive terminal index value of €173.





Judge Ian Miller of the renowned Lochend Herd in Scotland found his Senior Champion in the form of Derryolam Toby (et). A son of Texan Gie and a Doonally New bred dam, Toby was bred and exhibited by Niall McNally from Co. Monaghan. The Champion may have been short on stars, but not on quality, romping his way to €9,400. After some lively bidding Tateetra Farms in Co. Louth had the final call on this one.

Selling at €8,500 was the first prize-winning Corney Toby for Cavan man, David Magee. This powerful October 2022 born bull is a son of Goldstar Hugo 2 (et) and the homebred Corney Nancy (et). Toby was no stranger to the show ring, having picked up the Senior Male Calf Championship at the National Calf Show in September. Again stars didn't hamper proceedings in the sales ring, with bids coming in fast from all corners of the ring.





Claiming the Overall Junior Championship was Goldstar Treasure (et) for Martin Ryan from Co. Tipperary. This 13 month-old son of Goldstar Echo comes from the 2022 National Charolais Show Champion, Goldstar Pepite, who is a full sister of the popular new French bull, Reglisse. Once again terminal stars were in abundance along with a calving figure of 5.5% on beef cows. He changed hands at €9,100, selling to fellow Tipperary man Michael Cosgrove. The day's Reserve Senior Champion went to Basil and Victoria Kells with Dalehill Teddy. A first prize- winner from the oldest class of bulls, Teddy is a son of Clenagh Jasper 2 and a Major bred dam. This bull had enjoyed a productive year on the show circuit, claiming a number of red rosettes along the way. Despite being scarce on stars, the Cavan bred bull went on to sell for €8,400.



Donegal breeder Pat McClean also hit the €8,400 mark with Roughan Thomas. A second prize-winner in his class, Thomas is a son of Roughan Justbeau and a homebred dam by Roughan Jason. Stars were plentiful on this one, packing a five-star replacement index of €111 along with a terminal index value of €167. Pat also traded Roughan Tuff for €5,500, Roughan Twit for €4,800, and Roughan Tweet for €4,000. Rounding off a buoyant day's trading for the Donegal man.



Andrew Norris and Darragh McManus had a tremendous day at the Office, selling their five offering's for an average of €5,960. One of the highest index bulls in the catalogue, this one caught the eye of pedigree breeder Flor McCarthy from Co. Kerry. Dream-







The herd has bred to 100% artificial insemination over the years, with the focus being on a mixture of both replacement and terminal sires used. The emphasis which is placed on the milking ability and the fertility of the females in the herd has certainly led to an attraction of visitors to the farm. It was a certainly an eye opening herd to admire and a big thanks to Sebana and her family for being so welcoming and for hosting the club.

















When our first visit was over, we travelled to North Co. Dublin to visit the Country Crest farm belonging to Gabriel Hoey and managed by our club member Niall Maguire. Again, this farm is a state-of-the-art operation which can see up to 2,000 head of cattle finished annually - alongside a pedigree herd of Angus and Herefords. Their feedlot consists of quality commercial Charolais and Limousin heifers.

With the sun shining, the club was warmly welcomed with a delicious barbeque of Charolais meat that was specially prepared for the club. The meat was from Charolais crossbred heifer that graded a U + 3 =, with a carcass weight of 413kg and had a kill out of 59.5%.

There was also a free raffle of 10 meat boxes to the value of €50 that had been kindly sponsored by Country Crest and the Irish Charolais Cattle Society.

We were then given an indepth tour of the farm and told about the focus on meat quality, early finishing and suitable carcass weight to meet market demand.

HALL OF FAME AWARD 2023

The Council of the Irish Charolais Cattle Society selected Patrick Stephens of the Rosanna Charolais herd as their National Hall of Fame nominee for 2023. The awards ceremony took place in May in the Sheraton Hotel, Athlone, at which all nominees received their awards.



The Rosanna herd has become well recognised throughout Ireland and the British Isles as a noted source of quality stock since it's establishment in the mid 1970s.

Pat was one of the early members of the Irish Charolais Cattle Society, starting off with a lifetime membership in the spring of 1976. Over the years, the herd has gone from strength to strength under Pat's stockmanship.

In the early years, Rosanna herd won many fatstock show championships in locations such as Rathdowney, Ashford, Baltinglass and Edenderry. The herd has also won many pedigree Charolais championships such as Tinahely, Tullow, Tullamore, Naas and Goffs.

Over the years, the herd has used some notable breeding bulls such as Rosanna Vulsain, Rosanna Fameux and more recently Rosanna Olmetta. A bull that has made a lasting impression on the Rosanna Charolais herd is Fameux. After being used across the herd, he was sold to fellow pedigree Charolais breeders Cliftonpark Charolais herd in Worcestshire, England. While in the UK, Fameux continued to have a prolific impact siring Cliftonpark Madoc who topped the Welshpool Charolais sale in 2017. His bloodline can still be found throughout the Rosanna breeding females today.


In recent years, many Rosanna bred bulls have sold to pedigree herds in the UK. Rosanna Jupiter, probably the best known of these, was sold to the Caylers Charolais herd owned by the Barker family in Hertfordshire, England. Jupiter went on to breed exceptionally well at Caylers with sons topping sales across the UK for the past five years. In 2020, Jupiter himself

won the Great British Charolais Summer Show. Six sons of Jupiter stand in pedigree herds in the UK today, with grandsons picking up championship awards at the recent Stirling bull sales.


Rosanna bloodlines have had a lasting and positive impact on many herds throughout Ireland and the UK. Two well-known successful herds who purchased foundation females from Rosanna are Dromiskin and of course Ashleigh. The iconic Ashleigh Admiral who sold for €20,000 and the Highland show champion Ashleigh Victor are both descendants from the herd's foundation cow Rosanna Hazel.

Today, Pat runs the herd on a strictly commercial basis to produce sound quality stock with high health status, that go on and do well in other herds. All cows, must calf every year, have good milk, temperament and are bred to the best bulls that can be sourced with strict selection on function and breed character. The objective of the herd is to produce Charolais that are easy calving, have high growth rates with good feed conversion.

Pat still travels in search of new bloodlines to enhance the Rosanna herd. Over the years, he has gained a vast knowledge of the breed which he shares with many other breeders today. He is a worthy recipient of this year's award and the Society is honoured to have selected him as their nominee.



ICCS SUCKLER HERDS COMPETITION 2023 LARGE HERDS WINNER



Coming out on top in the large herd category of last year's ICCS Suckler Herds Competition was the overall winners from 2021, Brian and Jim O' Leary from County Clare. The pair run a calf to weanling system that can only be admired. The sheer quality of the weanlings on this farm is nothing short of exceptional.


The herd comprises of approximately 100 suckler cows which are predominantly Limousin, Belgian Blue, Saler and Charolais crosses. In the past the cows would have been first generation cross cows from the dairy herd. However, in recent year's they have moved to all second-generation cross cows from the dairy herd. Brian explains the reason for this 'the type of the dairy cow has changed and for that reason we needed to move another step away from the first cross to keep the quality in our calves'. The cows are crossed with Cha-

rolais stock bulls every year. All is also used within the herd to keep a small number of replacement's coming on. Cows calve down in the Spring and Autumn, mainly to spread out the workload at calving, as Brian also work's off farm.






The two stock bulls used on the farm up until this year were both sired by the well-known AI sire Fiston, out of a Lisnagre Elite bred dam. Both bulls crossed excellently on the herds various cow types. It is clear to see that they bred calves which were easily born and develop rapidly after birth. The O'Leary's aim to breed U grade weanling's and sell most of their weanlings off farm to repeat customers every year. These customers have been putting these weanlings to beef for years with fantastic results.



The quality of the calves on this farm are one thing, but the performance and efficiency of the herd is the real standout. The average calving interval of the herd is 379 days. Mortality at birth is 0%. Mortality at 28 days is 0%. The number of calves/cow/year is 0.96, compared to the national average of 0.87.

Impressive performance for a herd of this size.

Grassland management is also very important to the Clare men, evident in the strip grazing techniques implemented on the farm.



The first two batches of last year's Spring born weanling heifers were sold off farm in the autumn to repeat customers. The first group averaged 356kgs and sold for €1,230. The second group averaged 340kgs and sold for €1,100. The first batch of weanling bulls averaged 380kgs and sold for an average of €1,420. One of the most impressive things about this herd is the consistency of the calves. They are likes peas in a pod, which is proven in their sale prices.

Just like in 2021, this herd was selected for its overall consistency, efficiency, and sustainability. What's even more impressive is the fact that the O'Leary's farm on all rented land and continue to turn a healthy profit every year.

The herd exemplifies what can be achieved with the correct management techniques, genetics and grassland management. Most of all, it illustrates what Charolais stock bulls can do on a range of cow types.



ICCS SUCKLER HERDS COMPETITION 2023 SMALL HERDS WINNER



Not far from Strokestown, Co. Roscommon, Michael Connellan and his son Jack have established a top quality suckler herd. The herd has become renowned for producing outstanding weanlings every year. The cows are mostly LMX and CHX, all crossed with a Charolais stock bull. They run approximately 20 cows and operate a split calving system between Autumn and Spring. The offspring are all sold as weanlings between eight to ten months old, in their local Mart in Elphin.

During their time farming the Connellan's have enjoyed remarkable success at the weanling shows and sales in Elphin, consistently picking up rosettes every year, against some of the best weanlings in the Country. They have found that the quality of their weanlings is very consistent due to the breeding, nutrition and care management that they provide. The grassland management, genetics and techniques that they operate on enables the herd to continually flourish. Two cows from the herd also came second in the Irish Charolais Super Suckler Cow and Calf Competition held in Elphin Mart in 2022. The pair's greatest success to date however came in 2022 when the herd was placed first in the small herd's category of the Irish Charolais Suckler Herds Competition.





In recent year's the herd has sold weanlings to Dovea Genetics for PR exercises, and the Irish Cattle Breeding Federation for research purposes. The herd's key performance indicators also back up the quality of the cattle.

The average calving interval of the herd stands at 388 days and the number of calves produced per cow per year was 0.99 last year.



The Connellan's have always run a Charolais stock bull, simply because they believe they are 'the best'. The current bull on the farm is Williamstown Mixey, a son of Pirate, out of a TZA bred dam. He was purchased from Aiden Farrell at a Society Show and Sale in Tullamore in 2017 and it is fair to say he is producing the goods. Last year's weanlings were sold in Elphin Mart at an average age of 9 months old. The weanling bulls averaged €1,432 at an average weight of 420kgs. The weanling heifers averaged €1,290 at an average weight of 387kgs. The Connellan's top heifer went under the hammer at €1,500, with the top priced bull in the batch hitting €1,640 at 430kgs. The prices speak for themselves.

SOCIETY FEES

Annual Membership - €50.00

(Due on 1st January each year)

New Membership Fees - €127.00

(includes entrance fee and €1 share in the Society).

Membership application forms may be downloaded from the Society's website or will be posted out on request from the office.

Calf Registration Fee - €45.00

(If paid by direct debit)

From the 1st of January 2018, it is compulsory for all members to pay via Direct Debit.

(Registration fee is €60.00 per calf, for breeders who have yet to return their direct debit mandate)

ET Calf Pedigree Registration Fee - €80.00

(ET = Embryo Transplant) (effective 1/4/24)

All ET born calves must be either DNA or Geno typed for parentage verified before pedigree registration is complete.

Please note that it is not possible to parentage verify an animal via DNA, unless both parents are also DNA typed and vice versa using Genotyping.

De-Registration

Heifers - Heifers bred in your herd can be de-registered up to 12 months of age and you will receive a refund of €40.00. In order to receive the refund, you must return the herd book certificate, along with a note stating that you wish to de-register the female to the office. Please note that once a female has been de-registered, she can never be re-registered.

Males - Males bred in your herd can be de-registered up to 16 months of age and you will receive a refund of €40.00. In order to receive the refund, you must return the herd book certificate, along with a slaughter docket for the bull and a note stating that you wish to de-register the bull to the office. Please

note that you will only receive the refund for males when both the herd book certificate and slaughter docket is received in the office.

Late Registration/Payment Fees

CONTACTING THE OFFICE

When contacting the office in relation to a registration query, please have the **FULL TAG NUMBER** of the animal available or if you are contacting about a payment query, please have your herd number to hand. This greatly helps us to help you.

POLLED ANIMALS

All pedigree Charolais calves registered with Polled genetics must be Genotyped before a pedigree cert can be issued for them. This will allow the Society to identify the Polled status of each calf at birth and classify them accordingly. Homozygous polled calves will be classified as (PDP) Pedigree Polled. Heterozygous polled calves will be classified as (PDX) Pedigree Polled Cross. In order to request a genotype kit for animal, you contact ICBF on 023 88 20452.

IMPORTED ANIMALS

To be eligible for pedigree registration an Export Certificate for the imported animal(s), and/or embryos, issued by the Herd Book of the exporting country must be forwarded to the office.

The registration fee payable for an imported animal or embryo (male or female) is €75.00.

All imported animals entering the Society's herd book must be tested for Progressive Ataxia before they can be accepted. The Progressive Ataxia results must be accompanied with the export certificate.

SHOWS & SALES REGULATIONS

- Judges and stewards must be treated with courtesy at all times.
- All entries must be properly halter trained.
- Vendors must wear a clean white coat or clean white shirt and tie.
- All animals must be Genotyped, to their sire and where possible their dam.

Genotyping results must be verified **prior to the closing date**.

All animals being entered into the Society shows/sales must be genomic tested for sire verification and must be verified prior to the closing date of entries. DNA verification will no longer be accepted. By having all animals genotyped, it will allow the Society to request the Myostatin status for each animal entered in Society sales and include their myostatin status in the sales catalogue.

- All bulls must be fit for sale

- BVD: Animals offered for sale at all Society run Shows and Sales must be tested and BVD virus free.
- All bulls must be fertility tested, within 60 days of the sale date. The Society's rules require that the fertility testing be carried out either by Brendan Regan, John McCabe or your own Vet.
- Weight: In order for animals to be eligible for entry into society run shows and sales, all animals must **NOT** have an Average Daily Weight Gain of more than 1.8kgs/day for males and 1.7kgs/day for females from birth to weighing at Society shows and sales, unless the animal has previously been verified by the Society. Birth weight of 60kgs for bulls and 55kgs for females is allowable. Breeders with animals exceeding these weight limits will receive on farm inspections.

Entry Fees:

Show/Sale Entry Fee - €20.00 per animal. Elite Heifer Show/Sale - €50.00 per animal (non-refundable)

Premier & Christmas Cracker Show/Sale - €50.00 per animal (non-refundable).

Inspections: Animals must pass an inspection for all Society sales and the Inspector's decision is final. For all shows/sales, other than the Christmas Cracker and Premier Shows/Sales, this inspection will take place on arrival at the Mart.

For the Christmas Cracker and Premier Shows/ Sales inspections will be held at various centres around the country. Animals at these inspection centres will be required to have an in-date compliance certificate.

At all sales, random blood testing of animals will take place at inspections.

Testicle Measurements: Testicle measurements must be taken by the vet or Brendan Regan, John McCabe or Tim Kelleher when carrying out the fertility test and recorded on the Vets fertility certificate or on Brendan Regan's, John McCabe's or Tim Kelleher's printout. All bulls at Society run Shows and Sales must meet the following minimum criteria for testicle size. Bulls not meeting the minimum criteria will NOT be allowed into any Official Charolais Society Show and Sale.

Age	Minimum Testicle Size
Less than 15 months on day of sale	30cm
Bulls 15 - 18 months on day of sale	31cm
Bulls 18 - 21 months on day of sale	31cm
Bulls 21 months and over on day of sale	33cm

In addition, for the Christmas Cracker, Premier and Elite Heifer Shows and Sales, ALL animals must be:

- Export Tested. Please ensure your vet uploads your test date/status onto the CMMS.
 Test must be in date for a minimum of three working days following the sale.
- You must provide a completed veterinary examination form stating that the animal has no abnormalities, for example mouth is correct i.e. check the dentition is correct and the incisor/teeth are biting on the upper pad, prior to the sale date. Copy of this certificate stating same must be presented to the inspector on the morning of the sale.

This form can be downloaded from the "sales" section on our website – www.charolais.ie, next to the entry form.

- All bulls must meet the minimum weight for age.

YEAR LETTERS

For calves to be registered as pedigree animals, they must be given a name. Each year that name must begin with a certain year letter.

For all calves born in **2023**, you must use a name beginning with the letter **U**

For all calves born in **2024**, you must use a name beginning with the letter **V**

For all calves born in **2025**, you must use a name beginning with the letter **A**

When registering calves, **do not** include the herd prefix.

CALF INSPECTIONS/CONTROL CHECKS

Rule 10 in the Society's Breeding Programme deals with calf inspections/control checks.

The Society reserves the right to check selected herds. The herd owner will be given 48 hours oral or written notice of the visit by the Inspector. A herd owner with a genuine reason may be allowed an extra 24 hours for the inspection, otherwise the herd owner cannot refuse admission to the Inspector unless in the most exceptional circumstances. If a herd owner refuses to co-operate in allowing an inspection within

5 working days from the date of notification, all calves in the herd under 90 days of age (at the time of the first notification) will not be eligible for entry into any Society run events for life. If any calves are moved out of the herd from the date of notification to the date of inspection, those calves will not be eligible for entry into any Society run events for life. All calves under 90 days of age and their dams must be penned for inspection and weighing. All cows in the herd must be presented for inspection. The Inspector will take a hair sample from at least one calf and its dam for DNA/Genotype parentage verification during the inspection.

(b) The maximum weight gain permitted for MALE Charolais calves 1 – 90 days old is 2 kg per day along with their birth weight.

The maximum weight gain permitted for FE-MALE Charolais calves 1 – 90 days old is 1.75 kg per day along with their birth weight.

(c) Herd owners must notify in writing the society's secretary within 5 working days, of any bull calf born with a 60 kg and over birth weight and any heifer calf born with a 55 kg and over birth weight. If the facility for weighing calves is not available to the herd owner, the society's secretary should still be notified in writing of a 'suspected' heavy birth weight within the said period. Unless such heavier birth weights (or suspected heavy weights) are notified to the society within 5 working days of birth, they will not be taken into account for the purposes of these rules.

(d) Unless notified to the Society within 5 working days of birth, any calf which is found to be exceeding the above weight gains at any time under 90 days of age, that calf will not be eligible for entry into any Society run events for life.

SEMEN ROYALTY FEE

Please check with your supplier before purchasing the straw. We will endeavour to maintain an up-to-date list on the Society's website. The bulls listed below are those on the list as of September 2023. Royalty fees are payable on all the bulls listed below.

Royalty fees are collected by the Society at the time of pedigree calf registration and passed on to the owner of the bull. The Society charges a small fee to the owner of the bull for this service.

The Society operates this scheme so that a greater number of bulls are available to members at a reasonable cost. If you don't have a calf to register, you don't pay the fee.


